MAIN DISCUSSION POINTS

- Current state and trends of MEP Engineering Firms

KEY TAKE-AWAYS

- There is an education process:
 - Owners need to understand what is available and be able to dictate the process.
 - Plan Reviewers/Code Enforcers changes need to be made so that these people can look at a model besides relying on the design team to take the model to 2D. (Future unknown in this area)
 - Design Team as design teams change, (from drafters to modelers and as engineers learn to model/add information) there is a need for education on the design side as well.
- During the session, about half the attendees saw the future of VDC going in the direction where the design team would be creating a model that would be used for construction. The other half saw more of a traditional approach where there would be a design intent model and then the construction team would take that model to add more detail in order to create a construction model.
- If the design team needs to create the construction model, then we will see several changes in workflows/contracts/etc. For example, the following ideas were mentioned:
 - More design-build projects.
 - More collaboration during the design process.
 - o Contractors hiring design firms for design-build projects.
 - o Designers being educated more on how things are actually constructed.
