



## Required Pre-work for CD6615-L: Take a picture, it will last longer: Design in Fusion 360 with help from Recap 360

Due to the cloud-based nature of Fusion 360, there are a few helpful steps that will help the class to run smooth. This handout will walk through the required steps to insure that at class time, we can jump in and start learning.

### Step 1: Creating a Fusion 360 Account

1. Browse to the Fusion 360 website
  - a. <http://fusion360.autodesk.com/about>
2. Download a Free Trial
  - a. Select the Download a Free Trial button



- b. Run the Installation file when the download is complete
3. Follow the prompts to Install Fusion 360
4. Launch the application
5. Once the application is launched you will be prompted to either sign-in with your Autodesk ID or to create an account.

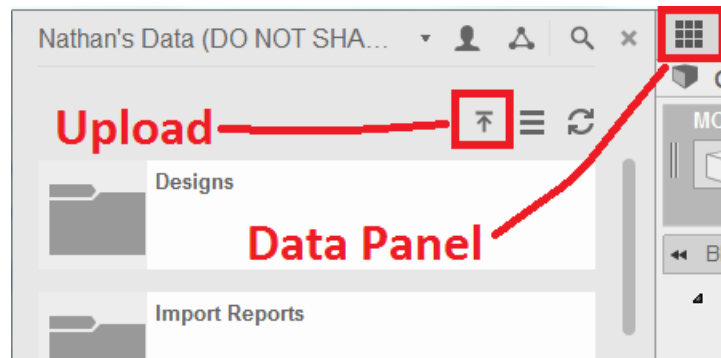
6. If you do not have an Autodesk ID, please create an account. If you do have an Autodesk ID, use your Autodesk ID to sign in.
7. Follow the prompts to create an account or sign in, it may take a few minutes to generate the account (this is why we to do this before the class!).

## Step 2: Uploading required files

In the folder you found this document, you'll find a file CD6615-L.f3d. You will want to upload this file to Fusion 360 before the class. This file is a completed data set from this class.

### To do this:

1. Open the data panel in Fusion 360
2. Select the Upload button



3. Select Browse and then select **CD6615-L.f3d**
4. Select the Upload button in the upload dialog to begin the process. This may take a few minutes
5. Once the upload is complete, the design will appear in the data panel.

## Step 3: Being familiar with the Interface

This class is listed as an intermediate level class. The basics of the program will not be covered during the class. It may help to go through the Step by Step tutorials located in the help menu of Fusion 360.
